

With a focus on the overall goal, major region, and specialization, as well as a target to expand the coverage of poverty alleviation, CFPA was determined to bring about actual fruits of success. Efforts were made to make full use of our advantages, deeply mobilize social forces, carefully utilize social resources, and advocate the participation of all walks of the society in poverty alleviation.

With a focus on the goals and tasks of "two concern-free and three guarantees" and the requirement of targeted poverty alleviation, CFPA intensified its efforts to implement "Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors" aimed at major labors of registered poverty-stricken families, expanded the coverage of programs such as the Nutritious Meals Program, the Child Companion Plan, and the Bridge Construction Project that help improve the living conditions of poor children, to poverty-stricken areas, carefully organized the New Great Wall Scholarship Program for high school and undergraduate students in poor families, and continued to promote the development of rural tourism in poverty-stricken areas through the Bona Vila Program, which integrates the development of three industries, explored and promoted poverty alleviation through e-commerce and consumption that drives the sales of product produced in poverty-stricken areas, and deepened the mobilization of the general public to participate in philanthropic programs such as the One Yuan Donation Initiative, Great Walker, Fundraising Advocacy by Undergraduate Students, the "Love without Borders" International Fundraising Event, the "Little Philanthropic Activist", as well as the "Little Disaster Reduction Activist". Great efforts were made to build a platform between donors and beneficiaries to convey caring messages and spread the concept of honesty and friendship. Our actions were welcomed and supported by both participants and beneficiaries. CFPA also implemented the international emergency relief and poverty reduction work in countries along the Belt and Road, stepping up and speaking up for building community of common future for human beings with actions, so that the beneficiaries can feel the strong appeal of China's poverty reduction experience.

Thanks to the trust and support from all partners, in 2018, CFPA received donations of RMB 733 million, and input RMB 643 million in total, with 6.12 million person-times of beneficiaries, achieving the goal of the first year of CFPA's three-year plan for poverty alleviation. International projects were carried out in nine countries: Myanmar, Nepal, Cambodia, Ethiopia, Sudan, Uganda, Namibia, DPRK and Ghana.

2019 is the 70th anniversary of PRC and it will be the critical year for the thorough success of poverty alleviation. CFPA will also embrace its 30th anniversary. CFPA will always remain true to our original aspiration, keep our mission firmly in mind, continuously strengthen our own development, closely focus on the overall goal and overall task of achieving poverty alleviation in an all-round way, and continue to implement the projects of targeted poverty alleviation and poverty alleviation facilitation thoroughly and carefully. As a transparent, trustworthy, and philanthropic organization, CFPA will put great efforts into inviting more social forces and the general public to join the great cause of poverty alleviation so that the participants will obtain personal fulfillment, and more poverty-stricken areas and population will receive help and feel the love and strength from the whole society.

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


OUR 2018




Annual Donation (hundred million)

Annual Number of Beneficiaries (10,000 person-times)




POVERTY ALLEVIATION THROUGH HEALTH CARE



The health and sanitary conditions of the poor population have always been one of the top concerns of the society and the world. At present, there are widespread problems in poverty-stricken areas in China, including insufficient medical services, malnutrition among children, imperfect child welfare protection systems, and difficulties in caring for the elderly. These problems affect the physical and mental health of the poor.

In the past 30 years, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation has launched philanthropic programs such as the Maternal and Infant Health Care Program, Nutritious Meals Program, Child Companion Plan, Caring for the disabled and the mentally-challenged elderly people, Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors etc, tried hard to build a comprehensive support system for maternity subsidies, medical personnel training, medical equipment and material assistance, reduce the incidence of malnutrition among children, ensure the nutritional needs of children in the process of growing up, build welfare support and child protection systems for rural left-behind children and children in distress, and provide health care insurances for the major labors of registered poor households so as to reduce the incidence of poverty caused by illness, aiming to facilitate poverty alleviation.



01 Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors

In 2017, under the guidance of the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development and the National Health Commission, CFPA partnered with Alibaba Philanthropy, and the Philanthropy & Insurance Platforms of Ant Financial Services, aiming at targeted poverty alleviation strategies, designed and launched a philanthropic insurance project that provides insurances for the major labor in a family, hereinafter referred to as "Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors Project. This project focuses on the population who fell into poverty due to illnesses. The Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors Project provides tailored poverty alleviation insurances to poverty-stricken households with registered cards aged between 18 to 60 years old, so as to reduce the incidence of poverty caused by illness. The project utilizes advantages of the Internet and the block chain technology to ensure complete transparency through tracking of funds.

From July 12, 2017 to December 31, 2018, the project raised funds totaling RMB 136.18 million, benefiting a total of 4,253,200 person-times in 66 counties (cities/districts) in 12 provinces (autonomous regions), with an input of RMB 107.54 million.

In 2018, funds raised totaled RMB 119.53 million and expenditure totaled RMB 92.36 million, providing supplementary medical insurances for 3.44 million registered poverty-stricken households

02 Nutritious Meals Program

In 2008, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation launched the Nutritious Meals Program, a philanthropic program focusing on improving children's nutrition in poverty-stricken areas. After years of practice and exploration, CFPA has gradually formed a three-in-one program including nutritious meals, kitchen renovation, and nutrition knowledge promotion.

From October 9, 2008 to December 31, 2018, funds raised for the program exceeded RMB 310 million, and the accumulative input exceeded RMB 280 million, covering 96 counties (cities, districts) from 46 cities (prefectures) in 14 provinces (autonomous regions): Sichuan, Yunnan, Guangxi, Guizhou, Hunan, Hubei, Liaoning, Hebei, Fujian, Henan, Xinjiang, Heilongjiang, Anhui, Jiangxi, benefiting 936,000 person-times, providing 51 million nutritional meals for students, with the establishment of 1,748 standardized kitchens of love. Meanwhile, school feeding programs were carried out in Cambodia and Ghana. In addition, the program provided approximately 762,000 packages of Vita Meals for 605,000 person-times in 20 provinces across China.

In 2018, the Nutritious Meals Program raised funds of RMB 46.42 million and input a total of RMB 37.48 million, with a coverage of 29 counties (districts) from 18 cities (prefectures) in 6 provinces (autonomous regions): Yunnan, Guizhou, Guangxi, Xinjiang, Hunan and Hebei, providing 6.03 million nutritious meals for students, with the establishment of 281 standardized kitchens of love, benefiting more than 138,000 person-times of students. Meanwhile, the program provided a total of 21,000 packages of Vita Meals for 13,000 person-times. (Accumulative donation and expenditure amount includes international nutritious meals, kitchens renovations by the Moving Forward Plan, and kitchen renovations for post-disaster reconstruction. Donation and expenditure amount in 2018 do not include international nutritious meals or kitchens renovations by the Moving Forward Plan.)

03 Child Companion Plan

Statistics show that there are currently about 6.97 million left-behind children in China. To fully grasp the information of left-behind children, identify and report children's needs, provide them with welfare services, CFPA launched the Child Companion Plan in October 2015. The Child Companion Plan adopts the model of "one person, one family and one tie". With the "companion mother" as the starting point, the "companion home" as the platform, and the county-level horizontal linkage mechanism as the guarantee, the plan establishes a guardian network for left-behind children at the village level, explores effective ways to protect their welfare and rights, and provides a reference for the landing of government policies.

From October 28, 2015 to December 31, 2018, the Child Companion Plan raised a total of RMB 43.47 million, and local governments provided a support of RMB 8.20 million, which means 84.1% of the funds came from enterprises and the general public, and 15.9% came from local governments. At present, the Plan covers 353 villages in 34 counties and districts in 4 provinces, including 24 poverty-stricken counties and 215 registered poverty-stricken villages. The Plan covers nearly 190,000 children and has collected and addressed 95,600 cases of children's welfare needs. The Plan has been welcomed and recognized by local governments, partners, children and parents.

In 2018, the Plan raised funds of RMB 15.88 million, input RMB 11.56 million, collected and addressed 70,600 cases of child's welfare needs. Companion mothers organized 26,100 times of activities, involving 347,900 person-times of children and 66,000 person-times of parents. In 2019, the Plan will expand to other provinces including Guizhou, Jiangxi, Yunnan, Anhui and Hubei.

04 Protection of Maternal and Infant Health

The Maternal and Infant Health Care Program targets at reducing maternal mortality and infant mortality, and improving maternal and child life support and health conditions in poverty-stricken areas.

The Program carried out 120 action items for maternal and infant health care, the Help Me See project, and the critical illness project.

From the year 2000 to December 31, 2018, the Maternal and Infant Health Care Program received more than 160 million yuan in donations and investment. The Program covered 26 counties (cities and districts) in 11 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions) including Yunnan, Chongqing, Fujian, Ningxia, Anhui, Sichuan, Shanxi, Hebei, Hunan, Liaoning and Beijing, benefiting more than 691,000 person-times.

In 2018, the Maternal and Infant Health Care Program invested about 2.76 million yuan, benefiting about 46,000 person-times. Among them, the 120 action items for maternal and infant health care covered 11 counties (cities and districts) of 5 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions), with a total number of beneficiaries at around 26,000 person-times, with rescue mission performed on 30 critically ill pregnant women. The Hearing Aid Project continue to cooperate with the China Hearing and Language Rehabilitation Research Center and benefited 75 hearing-impaired children and 16 parents. The Help Me See Project carried out eyesight screening on 20,000 children in Chengkou County, Chongqing and Yulong County in Yunnan.

POVERTY ALLEVIATION
THROUGH EDUCATION



Economic development in regions of harsh natural environments and remote geographical locations is slow. Parents need to go out to work, and the basic rights and interests of left-behind children cannot be guaranteed. Many rural primary school facilities are inadequate, students are lack of school supplies, and many students in poverty-stricken areas still face issues like lack of clothes and difficulties of attending schools.

Aiming at "poverty alleviation through education", we start from helping the children first, and through that helping the families move out of poverty. Education is an important way to block intergenerational poverty and reduce long-term poverty. To this end, from 2002 to now, CFPA has launched a number of philanthropic education programs to address different issues, such as the New Great Wall Scholarship Program, Panda Pack Project, Building Schools and Dormitories Program, Nutritious Meals Program, Moving Forward Program, etc. It is committed to promoting the comprehensive development of rural students in poverty-stricken areas and improving the conditions for study and living.

The Domestic Panda Pack Project is guided by the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development, and jointly launched by CFPA, China Post, and CCTV-6 on April 26, 2009, as a national philanthropy project dedicated to improving the comprehensive development and living conditions of rural primary school students in poverty-stricken areas. By organizing panda pack donations, the program send one-on-one care to rural children and help them realize childhood dreams.

From April 26, 2009 to December 31, 2018, the Domestic Panda Pack Project received donations of RMB 677.567 million, of which 3.71 million transactions of donations were by individuals, and 325,000 by organizations. The project has distributed a total of 5.35 million art packages for students, 493,700 warm packages for students, and 31,000 parcels for schools, benefiting 27,738 schools and 5.93 million students from 842 counties in 31 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions). At the same time, 6,549 families also benefited from the project.

In 2018, the Domestic Panda Pack Project received donations of RMB 67.44 million, input RMB 71.79 million, and issued 459,050 art packages and 89,656 warm packs for students, benefiting 2,871 schools and 548,706 students from 208 counties in 27 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions).

02 School Dormitory Building Program

On October 17, 2011, CFPA officially launched the School Dormitory Building Program, aiming to improve school facilities in poverty-stricken regions so as to build up warm families for poor students. The project has received strong support from the CCTV news channel and aroused widespread attention from all walks of society.

A large number of enterprises and individuals have generously contributed to the program. By the end of 2018, the project had received donations of more than RMB 120 million, supporting the construction of 228 schools and dormitories in 102 counties of 20 provinces, benefiting about 93,000 people. In 2018, the program received funds of RMB 1.01 million, input RMB 3.68 million, and supported the construction of 15 schools and dormitories, benefiting around 3,920 people.

03 New Great Wall Scholarship Program for High School and Undergraduate Students

The New Great Wall Scholarship Program for high school students aims to help high-school student with family financial difficulties by providing both financial and educational support, thus achieving poverty alleviation through education.

From September 2007 to December 31, 2018, the program received a total of RMB 178.64 million, input RMB 145.27 million and covered 346 counties (cities and districts) in 28 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions). 763 New Great Wall high school self-reliance classes had been established in 388 high schools of poverty-stricken counties. Direct beneficiaries of the program totaled 89,600 person-times, providing financial and educational support for 39,800 poverty-stricken high school students.

In 2018, the project received a total of RMB 79.19 million and input RMB 45.36 million. Nationwide, a total of 192 New Great Wall high school self-reliance classes were established in 173 schools from 143 counties in 20 provinces (autonomous regions and municipalities), benefitting 27,700 person-times.



The New Great Wall Scholarship Program for undergraduate students for impoverished undergraduate students provides financial support and talent support. The program aims to cultivate self-reliant talents, and guide students to pay back the society while striving to become a talented person.

Since the launch of the program in 2002, it has raised a total of RMB 286 million with 134,943 person-times of beneficiaries, covering more than 600 colleges and universities in 31 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions). New Great Wall Self-Reliance Clubs have been established in 104 colleges and universities to provide students with a platform where they can achieve personal development.

In 2018, the program raised funds of RMB 14.3308 million and input RMB 12.74 million. A total of 4,639 qualified students from 186 colleges and universities received scholarships.

In 2018, the program carried out three program monitorings, two college and university meetings. Program monitoring helps ensure that the program is carried out accurately and effectively; college and university meetings aim to understand the needs of college students, discuss the direction and new modes for program development, and serve as an effective way for donors and beneficiary students to connect with each other. Face to face communication helped narrow the distance between the donors and beneficiary students, and strengthen the relationship between them.

The Moving Forward Program is a development-oriented philanthropic project launched by CFPA to promote the growth of children in poverty-stricken areas and fairness in education for urban and rural areas. The program aims to improve the learning environment and the sharing of quality education resources for children in poverty-stricken areas through continuous social care and professional support.

The Moving Forward Program targets at poverty-stricken counties, and cooperates with the local education sectors to carry out the program in a certain proportion of primary schools in the county to help children in poverty-stricken areas grow in an all-round way. Through the demonstration and scalable effects of the schools participating in the program, it aims to push forward changes in local education policies and overall upgrades in local education quality.

From May 2014 to December 31, 2018, the project received a total of RMB 42.25 million, and input RMB 42.01 million, of which 22.91 million received and RMB 17.65 million input in 2018. The program benefited 5 poverty-stricken counties: Weining County of Guizhou Province, Zhenxiang County of Yunnan Province, Longlin County of Guangxi Province, Huize County of Yunnan Province and Zhaojue County of Sichuan Province, with a total of 38,790 beneficiary students and 1,609 beneficiary teachers.

POVERTY ALLEVIATION THROUGH INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT



Due to lack of technological support, insufficient scale of production or inconvenient transportation, poverty-stricken population in old industrial areas, areas with large ethnic minority populations, border areas and poor areas are less competent in the market, resulting in living standard being improved slowly. Aiming at presenting more opportunities of development and benefits for poverty-stricken areas and population, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation actively engaged in providing credit loan service to poor and small peasant households and endeavored to improve the basic conditions for production and life in rural areas. Through establishment of rural cooperation association, CFPA explored resources with local characteristics to open rural-style inns, and helped to link to the market. By alleviating poverty through development of e-commerce, among others, CFPA brought about the inner power of the folks and advanced the transformation of methods adopted for poverty alleviation from the feeding style to self-spontaneous ones.


The Bona Villa Program was launched by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation in 2013, aiming to alleviate poverty through development of rural tourism. By exploring a brand-new model of poverty alleviation through development of rural tourism+, the program intends to set up platforms bridging the rural areas and the outside world, re-evaluate the poverty-stricken villages and create chances for development for them. On the basis of rural residents association, the program facilitates the sustainable development in rural areas by actively attracting social capital, information, faculties and other key elements.

From May 2013 to December 31, 2018, this program received a donation of RMB 118 million, with an expenditure of RMB 59.35 million. In 2018, the amount of donation for the program totaled RMB 29 million, with an investment of RMB 29.25 million. The program benefited 19 villages in 18 counties (districts) of 7 provinces, among which 2 villages were rebuilt after disasters had stricken, 10 were moderately poor, 5 severely poor, and 2 ordinary. Among the 25,476 people in these 19 villages, 5,269 were registered poor households. By the end of 2018, 4 villages had started to operate the inns while the remaining 15 still hadn't started, of which 4 were in pilot operation, 3 under construction, 3 under planning stage and 4 yet to be initiated.

In 2018, the total revenue generated by inns in operation amounted to RMB 3.20 million, with an average annual income per capita of RMB 29,116. The program created more than 100 new jobs, and more than 30 targeted people for poverty alleviation have been employed. An indirect profit of RMB 3.44 million was created through tourism.

02 Shanpin E-Commerce



Shanpin E-commerce was set up by CFPA to contribute to poverty alleviation through social enterprise. With the conviction of bringing out value of honest production, Shanpin E-commerce supports the cooperation between rural households in poverty-stricken areas nationwide and their production of high-quality agricultural goods. By helping these small rural households access the market, Shanpin E-commerce improved their ability of collaboration, production and getting market access by utilizing the power of the market itself. As a result, a sustainable development can be maintained towards poverty alleviation and the trust between the households and consumers can be established.

From 29 January 2015 to 31 December 2018, Shanpin E-commerce invested more than 40 million yuan to philanthropy programs (including planned investment) and produced 17 categories of agricultural products. The programs covered 10 target counties for national poverty alleviation, 12 severely poor counties, and helped 27 associations for poverty alleviation and 2 associations for cooperation.

In 2018, Shanpin E-commerce produced 13 categories of products, including Shimian yellow mandarin orange, Baise mango, Ya'an red heart kiwifruit, and southern Xinjiang dried fruit. The total sales of agricultural products from project cooperation associations in poverty-stricken counties reached RMB 20.44 million, with add-on sales of more than RMB 60 million. The income of 16,044 households (including 2,152 registered poor households) increased by an average of more than RMB 800. Other impressive numbers included: 8 video documentaries, 110 training activities, 278 visits and on-site work, 34 product and brand marketing events, 350 million Internet traffic, support from 20 actors and actresses, and reports by more than 50 media agencies.

03 Bridge Construction Project

Bridge Construction Project was initiated in 2007 in joint efforts by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, Jiangling Motors Corporation, China National Automotive Journalist Association and China Automotive News with the purpose of building convenient bridges in poverty-stricken areas for those in need.

From 2007 to the end of 2018, the project had received RMB 49.8 million of donation and had implemented 727 bridge projects in total. The project brought convenience to 146 counties in 24 provinces and benefited more than 1.1 million person-times.

The project received RMB 3.34 million in 2018 and implemented 76 bridge projects, benefiting 17 counties in 7 provinces and 71,083 person-times. The year witnessed the completion of 60 constructions with a total input of RMB 5.25 million.

04 Microfinance

Microfinance is a small and micro financial service supplier that takes root in rural areas. It aims at providing tailored multidimensional services, including small-amount credit loan, insurance, investment and e-commerce business, for middle and low income people in rural areas who can hardly enjoy services of traditional financial institutions and helps them live a good life through development, production and growth in earnings.

By the end of 2018, CFPA Microfinance Management Co Ltd set up small-amount loan projects in 21 provinces and 313 branches nationwide, offering RMB 40.74 billion of 2.50 million loans and benefiting over 5 million households.

In 2018, 430,900 loans were granted and the amount totaled RMB 12.9 billion, with an average of RMB 29,943 per loan. The loan balance was RMB 9 billion as the average household balance reached RMB 25,203. The rate of risk loans over 30 days was 1.04%. Among 357,000 customers, 88.6% were farmers, 59.1% were female and 84.3% holding junior school or lower degrees.

Natural disasters hit China frequently and have become one of the major causes of poverty. China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation embarked on the path of humanitarian aid in 2003 with the aim to mitigate the sorrow and anxiety of people in disaster-stricken areas and respond to disasters more timely and accurately. CFPA also encouraged and promoted cooperation between government agencies and non-government organizations, as well as among NGOs, so as to build up a network of humanitarian aid, organize training on emergency prevention and aid, enhance the capacity and network building of stakeholders, and advance the post-disaster reconstruction with a people-centered principle.

01 Disaster Relief

Since the launch of humanitarian aid by CFPA in 2003, it has carried out 204 disaster aid operations and provided RMB 1.64 billion of funds and materials for disaster relief, directly benefiting 5.94 million person-times in 31 provinces (municipalities and autonomous region).

In 2018, the program received RMB 44.15 million of donation, including RMB 9.57 millions of funds, and RMB 34.58 millions of material, carrying out 27 disaster relief operations in 17 provinces (municipalities and autonomous region) and DPRK, and launched disaster prevention and mitigation work in 20 provinces (municipalities and autonomous region). The total amount of funds and materials invested added up to RMB 33.43 million, benefiting 116,100 person-times.

4·20 Lushan Earthquake Post-disaster Reconstruction Program was launched by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation on 12 May 2013, with the aim to reconstruct and bring people back to their normal life. By the end of 2018, the program had received RMB 306 million of funds and materials and input RMB 273 million, covering over 140 villages in 70 counties of 9 districts in Ya'an city and Chongzhou city and benefiting more than 150,000 person-times.

On 15 April, CFPA held a post-disaster reconstruction review on the 4·20 Lushan Earthquake Post-disaster Reconstruction Program and published outcome evaluation report and summary of the program, making a conclusion on current results.

8·03 Ludian Earthquake Post-disaster Reconstruction Program was launched by CFPA on August 2013. By the end of 2018, the program had received RMB 143 million of funds and materials and input RMB 138 million, covering 15 counties, including Ludian County, Huize County and Qiaojia County, benefiting more than 50,000 person-times.

8·8 Jiuzhaigou Earthquake Post-disaster Reconstruction Program was launched by CFPA on August 2017, focusing on aids for infrastructure construction and education. By the end of 2018, the program had received RMB 22.44 million of funds and materials and input RMB 8.83 million, covering Jiuzhaigou County, Pingwu County and Wen County, benefiting more than 20,000 person-times.

Through Disaster Prevention and Risk Reduction Program, CFPA raises public awareness on reducing disaster risks and enhances people's ability to respond to disasters. The program consists of three parts, raising public awareness, training, and aid. It has established a community disaster risk reduction model based on studies of disaster risk reduction in community, the training of first community rescuer and community aid equipment. It has also established a disaster risk reduction model for children, which is mainly based on popular scientific knowledge sharing activities, publication of educational materials and building of disaster risk reduction classrooms.

From 2016 to 2018, the program input RMB 5.89 million and benefited 201,000 person-times.

In 2018, CFPA launched SAY NO 512 National Disaster Reduction and Mitigation community activities, Disaster Risk Reduction Classroom Program, Little Disaster Reduction Activist, First Rescuer Training Program and research on the rural communities' capacity building for preventing and mitigating disasters. RMB 4.02 million had been input in this field, helping 78,000 person-times in 20 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions).



SUPPORTING NPO PARTNERS



With rapid development of philanthropy in China, philanthropic organizations face challenges like lack of ability to mobilize resources, ineffective governance of organizations and insufficient expertise. To this end, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation has launched various funding projects since 2005 and rolled out collaborations with non-profit organization partners in joint fundraising advocacy, sector-defined funding, action studies and influence development, etc. Through years of work, CFPA has carried out a number of major projects, such as Philanthropy for Everyone, ME Fund Plan for Philanthropic Innovation, Wonderful School Program, NPO Cooperation Project, Brightness Poverty Alleviation Program· Recovery from Cataract, as well as Pre-Schooling Mandarin Learning Action, so as to support the growth of NPO partners, push forward development of philanthropy in China and guide the participation of social organizations in poverty alleviation.



01 NPO Cooperation Programs — Mobilizing Social Forces to Participate in Poverty Alleviation

Brightness Poverty Alleviation Program· Recovery from Cataract

Brightness Poverty Alleviation Program· Recovery from Cataract is an action of poverty alleviation through health jointly launched by the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development and the National Health Commission in July 2017. It intends to establish a long-term mechanism to provide free treatment nationwide for cataract patients from registered poverty-stricken households by 2020.

Under the leadership of the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, as the organization in charge of fundraising, cooperates with its partner China Poverty Alleviation Promotion of Volunteer Service to manage and allocate funds, deal with program applications, and supervise the implementation and results of the program. Social Participation in Poverty Alleviation and Development of China serves as the platform for information dissemination and fund raising.

Pre-School Mandarin Learning Action

The Pre-school Mandarin Learning Action was initiated jointly by the Ministry of Education and the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development in July 2018 with the aim to facilitate pre-school children of ethnic minorities learn, understand, speak and use Mandarin.

State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development guides the Action while China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation is in charge of fundraising. China Poverty Alleviation Promotion of Volunteer Service is responsible for project implementation, and Social Participation in Poverty Alleviation and Development of China serves as a platform for information dissemination and fund raising.

The Pre-school Mandarin Learning Action has been piloted in 17 counties and cities across the Liangshan Prefecture, Sichuan Province. By the end of 2018, the Action had raised nearly RMB 20.1 million, with an expenditure of RMB 20 million.

ME Fund Plan for Philanthropic Innovation

ME Fund Plan for Philanthropic Innovation was jointly launched by China Minsheng Bank and China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation in 2015, aiming to fund innovative organizations and programs with development potential and social influence. The fund plan pays attention to and supports innovative practice and social influence building in the field of philanthropy, actively guiding social organizations' participation in poverty alleviation.

In 2018, the 4th round of the fund plan received 285 applications. After evaluation, eventually 23 organizations were granted with RMB 500,000 respectively as their innovation funding. In the 7-day voting session, more than 930,000 people expressed their likes for the applicants.



02 Philanthropy for Everyone ——Sharing Online Fundraising Resources with NPO Partners

Philanthropy for Everyone – Tencent Joint Fundraising Program

Philanthropy for Everyone – Tencent Joint Fundraising Program was set up in 2014, aiming to create a convenient platform for online fundraising, and for the public to participate in philanthropy.

By the end of 2018, the program had received more than RMB 200 million of donation and launched more than 1,800 projects, covering 767 counties (cities and districts) and benefiting 2.6 million person-times.

In 2018, The program supported a total of 101 partner projects to participate in the “99 Philanthropy Day” event, raising funds amounting to RMB 17.64 million, providing support for online fundraising training for more than 300 people.

“Goods for Good” Joint Philanthropy Plan

“Goods for Good” Joint Philanthropy Plan was initiated by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation and Alibaba Philanthropy in 2016. As the organization for public fundraising, CFPA gives full play to its experience and advantages in funding philanthropic programs, management, and supervision. Up to date, the program has provided fundraising support for 37 programs, receiving RMB 75 million of donation and benefiting 24 provinces (municipalities and autonomous regions) over 270,000 person-times. In 2018 alone, RMB 23.33 million was raised.

03 Wonderful School Program ——Facilitating NPO Partners to Take a Joint Action in the Field of Education

Wonderful School Program through NPO Partnerships was launched in 2018 by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation and other philanthropy organizations focusing on rural education. The goal of the program is to improve the development of primary schools in rural areas and provide students with good campuses, good presidents, good teachers and good classes. It intends to guarantee the education of rural students, eliminate the intergenerational transmission of poverty, cultivate self-confidence of rural children and develop their hope for the future.

In 2018, Wonderful School 99 Philanthropy Day Joint Fundraising Program organized student associations in 100 higher education institutes to carry out offline fundraising events. Funds raised amounted to RMB 4.82 million, which would be spent on rural primary school projects in Hunan, Yunnan and Shaanxi.

INTERNATIONAL AID & ADVOCACY



As President Xi Jinping pointed out, we should work tirelessly to build a community of shared future for mankind without poverty hand in hand. China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation upholds the philosophy of "Love without Border, People to People", and implements international programs based on the principle of "driven by local needs" and "local partnerships". By the end of 2018, CFPA has invested more than RMB 160 million in international poverty reduction and development programs, benefiting more than 450,000 person-times in over 20 countries and regions. In 2015, CFPA officially registered offices in Myanmar and Nepal.

In 2018, with the support of the Chinese government, enterprises, partners and the general public, CFPA's international aid and advocacy focus on the following six UN 2030 sustainable development goals, namely no poverty, zero hunger, good health and well-being, quality education, clean water and sanitation, and decent work and economic growth, implementing programs in Myanmar, Nepal, Sudan, Ethiopia, Cambodia, Uganda, Namibia, DPRK and Ghana.

In 2018, CFPA raised RMB 23.04 million for international programs, input RMB 29.1 million, benefiting 99,500 person-times. Programs implemented include the Pauk paw Scholarship Program for Undergraduates and Friendship Scholarship Program for Primary and Middle School Students in Myanmar, School Reconstruction Program and Women's Vocational Support Program in Nepal, Smiling Children School Feeding Program, Water Cellar Program and Women's Economic Empowerment Program in Ethiopia, Smiling Children School Feeding Program and Water Program in Sudan, and Brighter Future—Refugee Resettlement and Community Integration Program in Uganda. CFPA also collaborated with WFP to carry out feeding programs in Cambodia and Ghana. Emergency aids was implemented in DPRK.



Nepal

Panda Pack Project

As part of the endeavor to support Nepal's education, in 2018, 5,000 Panda Packs were distributed to primary school students in 9 districts of Nepal. On April 26, 2018, Chinese Ambassador to Yu Hong participated in the distribution of Panda Packs at the third anniversary of the 2015 Nepal earthquake held in Shree Phulchoki Secondary School. On July 30, Wang Yajun, Vice Minister of International Department CPC, and Pampha Bhusal, Nepali former minister, attended the donation ceremony at MAV school.

School Reconstruction Project

The Post-disaster School Reconstruction Project in Nepal has supported three schools. In addition to Yuba Sahabhagita School, which was completed in 2017, the reconstruction of MAV school is under construction and is scheduled to be completed in May 2019. The third school, Anandakuti School, received donations from the Enlai Foundation to rebuild its Karuna Building, which is expected to be completed in 2020.

Paukphaw Scholarship Program

Launched in August 2016, the Paukphaw Scholarship Program targets full-time undergraduate students in Myanmar with financial difficulties, and provides necessary financial support and capacity building activities for beneficiary students. In 2018, CFPA continued to support 700 beneficiary students in Yangon and Rakhine State. Panda Pack Project

Panda Pack Project is an active response to 'Education for All' Campaign and a concrete effort in advancing quality education in Myanmar. In 2018, pilot distributions of Panda Packs were carried out in Shan State, Bago Region, Rakhine State and Yangon Region of Myanmar, benefitting 10,000 primary students in need. U Myo Thein Gyi, Minister of Ministry of Education of Myanmar, and Dr. Lin Htut, Chief Ministry of Shan State of Myanmar, attended the distribution ceremonies in Bago and Shan respectively. The pilot project has received praise from the people and mainstream media in Myanmar.

China-Myanmar Friendship Scholarship Project

The China-Myanmar Friendship Scholarship Project is funded by the Chinese Embassy in Myanmar and implemented by CFPA Myanmar Office. The project is specially designed to advance education cooperation between China and Myanmar, and provides financial support for students with financial difficulty to complete their studies. In 2018, the project has reached eight regions throughout Myanmar, providing 681 scholarships and 309 grants in 28 schools with the total amount of 250,650,000 Myanmar Kyats. Meanwhile, CFPA Myanmar Office has paid home visits to 104 beneficiary students.

Ethiopia

Smiling Children School Feeding Program

In 2018, CFPA's Smiling Children School Feeding Program provided meals in 43 public schools to 4673 students in Addis Ababa. The first whole-coverage school feeding was implemented in Mentabarber School. School feeding not only encourages children to get into school but also attracts new enrolments from marginalized communities. A midline survey was carried out to evaluate the impact of the project on the beneficiary students' school dropout, attendance, and academic performance over the course of the program, as well as to analyze the contribution of the program to the nutritional and health improvement of beneficiary students.

Water Cellar Project

In 2018, with support from XCMG, CFPA built 40 water cellars in rural area of Ethiopia to provide access to clean and safe water in a renewable, sustainable and environmentally-friendly way. The project also promotes the protection and development of women and children.

Women Economic Empowerment Project

Through the provision of technical and marketable skills, the Women Economic Empowerment Project contributes to the creation of jobs for Ethiopia women by providing trainings on traditional handwork techniques. In 2018, funded by CGCOC, the second phase of the project was carried out in Lalibela, Ethiopia, and 50 women were trained on weaving and pottery-making skills.

Sudan

Smiling Children Program

The Smiling Children Program was launched in August 2015. CFPA has raised more than RMB 8 million for the Program in total. In 2018, CFPA supported 5074 students in eight public schools across three regions in Sudan, including Khartoum, Red Sea, and White Nile states. The program is highly recognized by Sudanese people and media.

Potable Water Project

In 2018, CFPA implemented the Potable Water Project in Sudan. The project aimed to provide access to potable water and latrines at the beneficiary schools of the Smiling Children Program. By constructing water tanks and connecting the school with the municipal water pipelines, the project provides clean water for the students and training for better personal hygiene.



Uganda

In 2018, CFPA, together with Mercy Corps, launched and implemented the Brighter Future—Refugee Resettlement and Community Integration Program in Uganda. The objective of the program is to enhance production and productivity, and ensure food security at Palbek settlement, Lamwo district.

To address the basic needs of refugees from South Sudan, CFPA provided cash support to 2500 households for food and other necessary items. The program also formed 1000 agriculture groups with households of both local community members and refugees, allowing refugees to access land and farm, which increased their income and contribute to sustainable livelihood. Meanwhile, CFPA is devoted to improve the local economic resilience to cope with negative effects of the refugee influx. In order to build a platform and mobilize more social forces to participate in poverty alleviation, in recent years, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation attached great importance to public participation in philanthropy and poverty alleviation. Therefore, CFPA seeks cooperation with different parties actively, launching a variety of popular philanthropic advocacy activities, such as One Yuan Donation Initiative, Walmart Fundraising Initiative for the Nutritious Meals Program, Great Walker, Fundraising Advocacy by Undergraduate Students, Future of Philanthropy – Youth Capacity Building, and the “Love without Borders” International Fundraising Event.

In 2018, CFPA continued to organize and implement the above-mentioned activities. It co-hosted the “Love without Borders” International Fundraising Event with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, carried out the 99 Philanthropy Day and “Goods for Good” fundraising programs on third-party platforms, and piloted advocacy activities such as Little Philanthropic Activist and Little Disaster Reduction Activist.

In 2018, there were 4.65 billion personal donations, and about 75,000 person-times of volunteers provided 1.14 million hours of volunteering.

01 Great Walker
— One Step One Change

The Great Walker was launched by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation in 2014. Participants are encouraged to form a team of four to work together to overcome difficulties and complete the 50-kilometer trekking challenge within the given time. With the slogan “One Step One Change”, the event expects people to mobilize the surroundings to support philanthropy and contribute to the comprehensive development of population in poverty-stricken areas.

From 2014 to 2018, the Great Walker has been organized for 5 years. 8,685 teams from more than 150 cities in over 10 countries worldwide applied for the event, with 22,238 person-times’ participation in the trekking, 15,983 person-times’ completion and 22,043 person-time’ volunteering. The event had raised RMB 32.66 million of funds in total and received 386,000 person-times of donation. It also received supported from over 50 enterprises, more than 50 celebrities and over one hundred media agencies.

In 2018, the Great Walker series were successfully held in Chengdu, Beijing, Xi County of Shanxi Province, Nanjing, Guangzhou, and Longmen Mountain. A total of 2,924 teams signed up to participate, and 6,137 people successfully completed the challenge. Funds raised totaled RMB 13.79 million of funds, of which RMB 769,100 was used for Child Companion Plan, RMB 1.67 million for Domestic Panda Pack Project, RMB 3.77 million for Love Kitchen Program, RMB 4.03 million for NGO Cooperation Projects, RMB 937,100 for the Xuhang Education Project, RMB 983,800 for Panda Pack Project, RMB 153,300 for the New Great Wall Project and RMB 1.42 million for Poverty Alleviation Project of Xi County in Shanxi Province.

02 Fundraising Advocacy by Undergraduate Students



Fundraising Advocacy by Undergraduate Students was initiated by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation with the aim to provide a philanthropic platform for undergraduate students to develop their comprehensive capabilities. Through participation and operation of philanthropic projects, volunteers are able to improve their personal resistance to difficulties, eloquence, and ability to organize and coordinate activities. Fundraising Advocacy by Undergraduate Students encourages volunteers to use the weekend to carry out public advocacy activities and fundraising challenges in post offices, shops, supermarkets and other places - volunteers provide 100 hours of service, malls provide venues for 100 hours, and the public donates RMB 100 individually. Full goodwill is passed on by good deeds as the kindness of the society is clustered to help children in poor areas.

From 2011 to 2018, the event has been held for 14 times. 388,000 undergraduate students from 285 colleges and universities in 126 cities participated in the event and raised RMB 74.91 million for primary students in poverty-stricken and disaster-stricken areas.

In 2018, the Warm Action and Monthly Donation Action were also carried out. 122 colleges and universities in 68 cities took part in it. 10,478 people were invited to participate in the Monthly Donation Action, raising RMB 9.82 million of funds. 60,815 undergraduate student provided 846,974 hours of service in total.

03 Future of Philanthropy —Youth Capacity Building

Future of Philanthropy was initiated by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation in 2013 to develop youth capacity. It aims to integrate social resources, support the development of philanthropic clubs or associations in colleges and universities, promote students' participation in philanthropy, and encourage young people to explore solutions to social problems in innovative ways. It expects to cultivate young people's creativity, ability of teamwork and social responsibility and contribute to a better future.

From 2013 to 2018, Future of Philanthropy has developed into a platform gathering Youth Philanthropy Colleges, Philanthropy Innovation Fund, and Philanthropy Practice. It has successively launched the Wrigley Environment Protection Action, Citi Undergraduate Students Educational Training on Finance, China Petroleum Talents Fund, SAP Youth Responsibility Dream+, Hilton Social Practice and other projects. In the past six years, the program supported more than 561 college and university associations, trained 1816 association leaders and benefited 800,000 young people.

In 2018, 274 philanthropic associations from 87 cities took part in Future of Philanthropy, among which 122 were core associations (participating annually for more than twice). The project influenced 300,000 undergraduate students directly. In 2018, Wrigley Environment Protection Action, Hilton Social Practice, China Petroleum Talents Fund, SAP Youth Responsibility Dream+ Competition, Tongdun Innovation Project, 99 Philanthropy Day 500X Youth Action, 2018 Undergraduate Student Philanthropy Leader Campus and regional forums were organized and carried out.

04 One Yuan Donation Initiative

One Yuan Donation Initiative is a national fundraising event jointly launched by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation and brands under Yum! China such as KFC and Pizza Hut. It encourages the general public to donate RMB one yuan to support the Nutritious Meals Program for children and kitchen equipment for schools in poor areas. The initiative offers opportunities for everyone to contribute to philanthropy. By starting with small kindness, the initiative intends to cultivate and evoke a sense of social responsibility of the public, promoting the concept of philanthropy for everyone.

From October 9th, 2008 to December 31st, 2018, the initiative carried out advocacy for 11 times, covering Yum! China restaurants nationwide. More than RMB 180 million of funds had been raised through 120 million donations. The project promote public philanthropy by setting one yuan as the threshold of donation, encouraging an easy philanthropic action in the whole society.

In 2018, the initiative lasted from August 11th to 31st, raising over RMB 17.87 million of funds and attracted more than 9 million person-times' participation.

05 Walmart Fundraising Initiative for the Nutritious Meals Program

Walmart Fundraising Initiative for the Nutritious Meals Program was jointly launched by China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation and Walmart China. It aims to improve the nutritious status of children in poverty-stricken areas and help with their all-round development through donations of consumers, Walmart and its suppliers.

From 2011 to 2018, Walmart and its outstanding suppliers donated over RMB 120 million, benefiting 220,000 person-times of students in more than ten primary schools in poor areas of Sichuan, Yunnan, Guizhou, Hunan, Guangxi and Hebei. Walmart China advanced the progress of philanthropy by taking full use of its own advantages.

From August 16th to 29th 2018, CFPA and Walmart launched the 4th Fundraising Initiative for the Nutritious Meals Program and received more than RMB 2.24 million of funds. During the activity, consumers were able to make donations at over 400 Walmart supermarkets and cashier desks of Sam's Club stores nationwide, with Walmart providing matching funds. At the same time, consumers can buy and donate Great Value products of Walmart, Member's Mark products of Sam's Club and certain QQ Star products of Yili from Walmart supermarkets, Sam's Club App, Jingdong flagship stores and Jingdong Daojia App, with Walmart and Yili providing matching funds.

06 The "Love without Borders" International Fundraising Event

The "Love without Borders" International Fundraising Event was initiated in 2009 by the Ms. Qian Wei, wife of Mr. Wang Yi, Minister of Foreign Affairs of China. Since 2016, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation became the co-host and so far carried out the event for 3 consecutive years, making it an influential platform for international philanthropic exchanges. The event attracted over 100 embassies in China, nearly 100 enterprises and hundreds of people from the public, and raised more than RMB 10 million yuan in total within 3 years.

On October 21st 2018, the 10th "Love without Borders—Hearing the Love of the World" International Fundraising Event was held. Wang Yi, Chinese State Councilor and Minister of Foreign Affairs, together with his wife Qian Wei; Zhang Yesui, Party Secretary of Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Le Yucheng, Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs; Wang Chao, Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs; Zhang Jun, Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs; Zhang Hanhui, Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs, and representatives from about 100 foreign embassies, international organizations and over 60 Chinese enterprises. The event attracted more than 10000 people and raised RMB 6.28 million of funds, which will be used for cochlear implantation operation and recovery training of hearing-impaired children in poverty-stricken areas of Northwest China.

In 2018, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation prioritized the launch of Moving Forward Monthly Donation and Alumni Monthly Donation Initiative, disseminating the concept of "More Giving, More Joy" through cooperation with different channels, enterprises and communities, and encouraging people to make regular, consecutive and small-amount monthly donations. By the end of 2018, over 35,000 people joined the initiative and their donation benefited more than 40,000 primary school students in poverty-stricken areas.

Through activities such as the Little Philanthropic Activist and 21-Day Monthly Donation Advocacy, 100,000 people began to follow the progress of the Monthly Donation Initiative. Donors can track the use of the funds through annual meetings for donors, field trips to the beneficiary areas, and Moving Forward urban and rural summer camps.



08 Internet-Based Philanthropy

Cooperation on Internet-Based Philanthropy with Alibaba

In 2018, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation raised RMB 227 million of funds through Goods for Good Platform, online philanthropy shops and Philanthropy Together Platform of Alibaba. More than 4.5 billion netizens and online shops supported programs of CFPA, including Panda Pack Project, Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors, Child Companion Plan and joint fundraising projects of 28 NGOs.

Philanthropy Together, a product jointly launched by CFPA and Alibaba Philanthropy, called on netizens to donate steps to participate in public philanthropy. Online business owners would exchange the steps to support the Sunshine Track Program. During the 95 Philanthropy Week, CFPA invited Yao Cheng, Zheng Kai, Liu Yan, Chen Qiaoen, Zheng Yuanchang, Zhang Tianai, Zhou Dongyu, Zhang Yunlong, Gao Weiguang, New F4 and other celebrities to form teams to donate steps. In 2018, netizens donated 70 billion steps and 140,000 of online business owners took part in the donation, contributing to the completion of 20 Sunshine Tracks.

Cooperation on Internet-Based Philanthropy with Ant Philanthropy

In 2018, CFPA worked with Ant Philanthropy on One Yuan Donation Initiative and advocacy activities of the "Love without Borders" International Fundraising Event. In the meantime, CFPA encouraged public participation in philanthropy through participation in step donation and cooperation with Ant Farm.

In 2018, 52.5 million person-times of netizens contributed to Health Insurance for Poor Families' Labors, Panda Pack Project and Smiling Children Program in Ethiopia of CFPA through Ant Financial Services.

Cooperation on Internet-Based Philanthropy with Tencent Philanthropy

In 2018, CFPA launched several key fundraising activities with Tencent Philanthropy, such as 320 Mail Plan, 512 Brand Week and 1017 Poverty Alleviation Day, to encourage the public to take part in philanthropy through walking. During 99 Philanthropy Day period, 138 programs of CFPA, partner social organization and enterprises took part in fundraising. More than 398,800 person-times of people made donations and RMB 22.4 million were raised in total (including matching funds from Tencent and enterprises). The funds would mainly be used to help disadvantaged groups including children, the elderly, and the disabled.

Cooperation on Internet-Based Philanthropy with Other Platforms

In 2018, CFPA also worked with Sina Micro Philanthropy, Meituan Philanthropy, Didi Philanthropy, Suning Philanthropy and Internet-based platforms like Social Participation in Poverty Alleviation and Development of China. In addition, CFPA connected and signed cooperation agreements with Shuidichou and Qingsongchou.

09 Advocating Enterprises to Participate in Targeted Poverty Alleviation

On January 15th, 2018, the Seminar on "Participation of Social Forces in Poverty Alleviation" was held in Beijing by the "China Poverty Alleviation" magazine. Xie Jingrong, Vice Chairperson (full-time) of the All-China Federation of Industry and Commerce, Hong Tianyun, member of the Party Committee and Deputy Director of the State Council Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development, and representatives from the Supreme People's Procuratorate, State-owned Assets Supervision and Administration Commission, Ministry of Health, National Tourism Administration, China Securities Regulatory Commission, China Poverty Alleviation Magazine, China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, as well as concerned business sectors attended the seminar.

Participants discussed in depth about poverty alleviation through economy, tourism, health care, e-commerce, and the mode of internet plus social forces. On April 13th, 2018, the "Training on Capability of Facilitating Poverty Alleviation for Securities Industry" was held in Xi County, Shanxi Province. The purpose of this training was to broaden the horizon of enterprises participating in targeted poverty alleviation through organizational training, experience exchange, case sharing and project site field trips. More than 200 people from the General Office of the China Securities Regulatory Commission, representatives of China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, representatives of the Xi county government of Shanxi Province, heads of poverty alleviation work from the securities industry, officials serving temporary positions in designated counties, and key leading officials in designated counties attended the training.

From September 12 to 15, 2018, CFPA and Dongxing Securities Co., Ltd. held a training course on targeted poverty alleviation capability enhancement in Shanghai. The training course invited representatives working at the front-line for poverty alleviation from Yunyang County of Chongqing, Shaoyang County of Hunan Province, Nileke county of Xinjiang, Linyi County of Gansu Province, Tongwei County of Gansu Province, Foping County of Shaanxi Province, Sihong County of Jiangsu Province, Tongyu County of Jilin Province, and representatives from China Eastern Airlines Group, China Forestry Group, and Jilin University of Construction. More than 110 people participated in the training.

From September 20 to 21, 2018, CFPA held the "Advanced Seminar on Poverty Alleviation for Corporate Senior Management" at the 6th China Charity Fair. More than 100 corporate executives from publicly listed companies, foreign-funded enterprises, private enterprises and financial enterprises attended the seminar.

1. Audit Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation (the "CFPA"), which comprise the balance sheets of company as at December 31, 2018, the business activities statement of 2018 and statement of cash flow for the year then ended in 2018, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the following financial statements based on <Nongovernmental Non-profit Organization Accounting system> present fairly, in all material respects, the financial status of CFPA as at December 31, 2018, and the result of its operation and its cash flows in 2018.

2. Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the China Standards on Auditing (CSAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants of the Chinese Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("CICPA Code"), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the CICPA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

3. Responsibilities of management and those charged with governance for the financial statements

Management of the CFPA is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with <Interim Regulations on Registration Administration of Private Non-enterprise Unites> and <Nongovernmental Non-profit Organization Accounting system>, and for such internal control as management is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

4. Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but it is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with CSAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with CSAS, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

(1) Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

(2) Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control.

(3) Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.

(4) Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.


